Forest Order No. 01-04-01-15-014

National Forest Systems Roads

Pursuant to Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations, Chapter II, Part 261, Subpart B, Section 261.50(b), the following act is prohibited on the Coeur d'Alene River District within the Idaho Panhandle National Forests:

Being on or using the following roads within Grizzly Complex Fire Area:

T51N, R4E, Sections 6, 7, 18

T51N, R3E, Sections 2, 3, 9, 10, 11, 12, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 24, 27, 28, 29, 30, 32, 33, 34, 35

T51N, R5E, Section 13

T50N, R3E, Section 3

Being on the following Forest Roads (36 CFR 261.54(e)):

Forest Road 602: from T51N, R4E section 7 (the south section line), north to Little Guard Peak.

Forest Road 802: from intersection with Forest Road 208 to Morris Creek in T51N, R3E, section 12.

Forest Road 513: from intersection with Forest Road 400 to intersection with Forest Roads 2367 and 1568.

Forest Road 2367: from intersection with Forest Road 208 to intersection with Forest Roads 1568 and 513.

Forest Road 400: from intersection with Forest Road 513 to intersection with Forest Roads 260 (Flat Creek Saddle).

Forest Road 260: from intersection with Forest Road 400 (Flat Creek Saddle) to intersection with Forest Roads 959 and 993.

Forest Road 993: from intersections with Forest Roads 959 and 260 to intersection with Forest Roads 1566 and 994.

Forest Road 994: from intersection with Forest Roads 1566 and 994 to intersection with Forest Roads 1569, 207 and 991 (Brown Creek Saddle).


This restriction is in addition to those stated in Subpart A, 36 Code of Federal Regulations Part 261 and becomes effective August 17, 2015 and will remain in effect until rescinded or revoked.

This restriction is necessary for the protection of public health and safety (36 CFR 261.53(e)) during wildfire activity.

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following individuals are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer or member of any organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

Violation of this prohibition is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. (16 U.S.C. 551 and U.S.C.3559 and 3571)
