Attractions and Considerations

The Bear Wallow Trail leaves National Forest Road 693 (NF-693) and heads south along the ridge between Scriver Creek and the Middle Fork of the Payette River. It leaves the grand fir forest type as it drops in elevation to the ponderosa pine types. As the trail descends it passes through some old burns and timber harvest units before terminating on private land. The trail provides access to the top of the One Spoon Trail, which drops down to the Middle Fork of the Payette. Please stay on the trails, this is a designated area for travel management.

Trail Beginning

Elevation: 5510 ft

Trailhead located on Scriver Creek Road (National Forest Road 693).

Trail Ending

Elevation: 3279 ft

The trail ends where it reaches private land.

Access:

From Crouch, head north on NF-698 for approximately 5.3 miles to Scriver Creek Road NF-693. Head west on NF-693 for approximately 11.1 miles to the trailhead.
