



Silver Creek Summit Trail #044

Length: 6.0 miles (9.7 km)

Attractions and Considerations

This trail starts out going north along an old roadbed to the ridge between Silver Creek and Bull Creek. At the summit views of Bull Creek and the Deadwood Ridge match any on the forest. After the summit the trail descends some steep slopes that require some skillful riding before reaching the Bull Creek Bridge and the junction with the Bull Creek Trail.

This is a very popular route with lots of motorcycle and ATV use, so please use caution and keep your speed down. In midsummer large bands of domestic sheep may be encountered. The trail ends in an area with very limited access so be prepared.

Trail Beginning

Elevation: 5402 ft

The Silver Creek Summit Trailhead is located at the end of National Forest Road 671E (NF-671E).

Trail Ending

Elevation: 4959 ft

The trail ends at its intersection with the Bull Creek Trail.

Access:

Take NF-698 from Crouch for approximately 15.0 miles to its junction with NF-671. Turn right on Nf-671 and travel approximately 10.2 miles to its junction with NF-671E. Proceed north on NF-671E for approximately 1.8 miles to the end of the road, where the trail begins.
