

Archaeological Site Protection

This archaeological site is being evaluated for nomination to the National Register of Historic Places. The project will also assess site damage from intensive recreation use and determine management needs for the protection of both cultural and natural resources.

Over the past several years, monitoring of the site has revealed that recreation use has led to a loss of vegetation, which in turn has intensified erosion from heavy rains and snow run-off. (The name of the site is sensitive information.)
