

Fish Lake Remount Depot Historic Structures

Project made possible through the Secure Rural Schools and Communities Self-Determination Act.

Built in 1922 and in 1934, the Fish Lake Remount Depot Historic Structures include some built by the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC). These historic buildings help tell the story of what it was like for early travelers to the McKenzie River and Santiam Pass area. Built on what used to be the Santiam Wagon Road Stop where weary travelers rested, these Forest Service Buildings housed firefighters, seasonal workers and more. Descendants of the old Stop became the Forest Service workers who ran and used the structures. Recently, they became eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places, but needed some restoration work.

Title II assisted with the restoration of the ones built in 1934. The project included replacing the roofs, removing lead-based paint, addressing water damage, repairing the foundation of one building, and partially replacing walls on two buildings.
