


Native Seed Collection and Growout

Project made possible through the Secure Rural Schools and Communities Self-Determination Act.

This project's goal was to collect and grow out native grass and legume seed to create a mix for restoration projects on federal lands. The seed mix is being used for erosion control on road shoulders and obliterated roads, and for restoration projects in riparian areas. Seeds will also be used for competitive plantings against noxious weeds, wildlife forage, erosion control along restored trails, and other projects where appropriate.
