

An Alaskan Salmon Viewing Experience



The pristine watersheds in the Chugach National Forest create an ideal home for wild salmon. Follow these simple rules to view the salmon in their natural habitat without disturbing them. They have worked hard to get here.

Please...

Stay on the Trail

Wetlands and stream banks are sensitive areas. The vegetation helps protect stream banks from erosion during periods of high water. Use established "pull outs" to get close to the stream.

Respect the Fish

Do not throw stones, or harass the salmon. This can disturb spawning and stress the fish.

Don't Walk in the Stream

Your foot steps could be harmful. Salmon eggs and newly hatched fry can remain buried in the stream gravels for up to eight months.

Don't Litter!

Wildlife can be harmed by discarded plastic and other garbage.
