

## Interim Priest Lake Annotated Bibliography

The following document is a work in progress that will provide references for historical documents, oral histories, maps and photographs of the Priest Lake area. The document is being prepared by Jamie Litzkow, a graduate student in Archaeology at Eastern Washington University and employee at the Idaho Panhandle National Forest. Jamie is visiting local, state and national archives to locate and copy references that help tell the story of the Priest Lake area. The documents are housed at the Supervisor's Office of the Idaho Panhandle National Forest, unless otherwise noted. Table 1 provides the archive location, who is completing the research and the status of the collections. The remainder of the document provides the actual references and summaries by collection location.

Provides a history of the Blister Rust Control Program from the viewpoint of the former Director of the Division of Forest Pest Control. The history of the program from 1909, until the early 1980's is covered, with highlights including camp locations and photographs, with highlights including camp locations and photographs.

Bradley, Stuart B.

1972 *Big Smoke*. Published by the author. Richards, Pflum, Karge, Inc. Chicago, IL.

This is a compilation of stories regarding the timber, mining industry, as well as early administrative activity in the Kaniksu National Forest. Pend Oreille County is emphasized.

Cohen, Stan

1980 *The Tree Army: A Pictorial History of the Civilian Conservation Corps, 1933-1942*. Pictorial Histories Publishing Co. Missoula, MT.

A pictorial account of the development and eventual demise of the Civilian Conservation Corps from 1933-1942. Highlights include various work projects and maps of camp locations from 1933 and 1938.

Cork, Marylyn and the Bonner County History Book Committee

1991 *Beautiful Bonner: A History of Bonner County Idaho*. Curtis Media Corporation, Dallas, Texas.

This book provides a detailed study of Bonner County, Idaho, including individual family and business histories. Also highlighted are churches, clubs, forests, farms, schools, and Clark and Sandpoint High Schools Centennial Projects.

Deaver, Sherri, and James E. Lieb

2000 *A Kalispel Cultural Geography*. Compiled by Ethnoscience, Inc. for the Kalispel Tribe of Indians Natural Resource Department.

This report is an overview of the history of the Kalispel Tribe of Indians and their presence in the Kalispel Country, from pre to post European contact. Included are tables and maps of known Kalispel villages and fishing sites.

DeSmet, Pierre-Jean

1983 *New Indian Sketches*. Ye Galleon Press. Fairfield, WA

This book examines Father DeSmet's records of travels to the Pacific Northwest and attempts to relate his encounters and route to specific, modern locations. Highlights include information on the Kalispell tribe, customs and locations, specifically in the Lake Pend Oreille region.

Estes, James F.

1967 *Tales of Priest Lake*, 2<sup>nd</sup> Edition. Published by the author. Spokane, Washington.

This contains reminiscences of various people who lived along Priest Lake starting around the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century. Provides history of east side of lake especially, but also good information about Little Lake (Upper Priest), including locations of mines, cabins and significant happenings.

1967 *Lost Mine of Priest Lake*. Illustrations by Alfred Skaar.

This is the published memoir of Albert Klockman highlighting his search for the location of the "Lost Mine", today known as the Continental Mine. Covering Klockman's life from his 1896 arrival to America, until January 1940, the diary contains a detailed history of the discovery and development of the mine and the lives of involved parties. The source provides a first-hand account of early mining development on both the Lower and Upper Priest Lake areas. Several passages give locations of mines, cabins, camps, trails, as well as human (and animal) burials.

This yearbook covers the enrollment, leadership, activities and locations of CCC camps from 1938-1939.

1991 *A Pictorial History of the U.S. Forest Service 1891-1945: Northern Region*. Pictorial Histories Publishing Co. Missoula, Montana.

This book provides a wonderful assortment of photographs from various projects and administrative sites in the Northern Region. Topics covered include timber, CCC, BRC, range, fires, and recreation.

This report gives a detailed overview of both the prehistoric and historic record of the Idaho Panhandle National Forest. Ethnographic research is highlighted covering all tribal affiliations within the forest boundaries, including the Kalispel.

Klockman, Albert

n.d. *A.K. Klockman Diary 1888-1940: Developer of the Continental Mountain Mine and Klockman Ranch at Porthill, Idaho*. No publication data. Copy on file at the Supervisor's Office. Coeur d'Alene.

This version of the Klockman memoirs differs slightly from *The Lost Mine*; however, it covers the same timeline of events. That is, the search for the "Lost Mine", the discovery and development of the Continental Mine and related happenings and personal histories.

1936 *Fort George Wright C.C.C. District Annual: Winter Enrollment 1935-36*. Fort George Wright District Civilian Conservation Corps, Moscow Publishing Company, Moscow, ID.

This yearbook covers the winter enrollment, leadership, activities and locations of

CCC camps from 1935-1936.

Leiberg, John B.

1899 *The Priest River Forest Reserve*. Department of the Interior, US Geological Survey. Government Printing Office, Washington.

This report covers some of the earliest observations of the Forest Reserve of the Priest River region, as well as areas in the immediate vicinity. Some topics covered include water supply, minerals, timber and soils.

Livingston-Little, D.E.

1965 *An Economic History of North Idaho, 1800-1900*. Journal of the West, Lorrin L. Morrison Printing and Publishing, Los Angeles, California.

This book explores the economic history of northern Idaho from 1800-1900. It covers all major aspects of early Northern Idaho history, including the fur trade, the presence of missionaries, the discovery of gold, as well as transportation and agricultural development.

Marti, Duane

1976 *An Archaeological Reconnaissance of the Priest Wild and Scenic River Study Area Idaho Panhandle National Forests*. University of Idaho Anthropological Research Manuscript Series, No. 24. Laboratory of Anthropology, University of Idaho, Moscow.

Provides a quick overview of archaeological research in the Priest Lake Wild and Scenic River Study Area up until 1976. Included is a list of known sites and a map of possible sites.

Otis, Allison T., William D. Honey, Thomas C. Hogg and Kimberly K. Lakin

1986 *Forest Service and the Civilian Conservation Corps: 1933-42*. United States Department of Agriculture, Forest Service FS-395.

This book offers a history of the Civilian Conservation Corps on a national level. The overview includes short histories of CCC presence and related regional projects from 1933-1942.

Peterson, Henry A.

1968 *Recollections and Memoirs of an Early Day Forest Ranger in the Priest Lake Country*. Published by the Author. Priest River, ID.

The reminisces of an early Forest Ranger in the area now known as the Priest Lake Ranger District. Highlights include details of the early administrative activities and projects by the Forest Service, topics covered include the CCC, fire control, ranger stations, logging camps and timber sales, and mining.

Renk, Nancy F. and Tony McLeod

1991 *Driving Past: Tours of Historical and Geological Sites in Bonner County, Idaho*. Bonner County Centennial Committee. Sandpoint, ID.

Provides a quick study of historical and geological sites in the Sandpoint Planning Zone up until 1991. Highlights include locations of possible historical/archaeological sites in the Priest Lake and Priest River area as part of a tour through the region.

Simpson, Claude and Catherine

1981 *North of the Narrows: Men and Women of the Upper Priest Lake Country, Idaho*. Keokee Co. Publishing, Sandpoint, Idaho

Memoirs of Claude and Catherine Simpson concerning the Priest Lake country, Pioneers, and early happenings. The Upper Lake is emphasized, but contains substantial information on both lakes.

Sims, Cort

1984 *The Log Chutes of North Idaho*. In "Cultural Resources", Report No. 8, USDA Forest Service, Northern Region.

This report examines the development of log chutes in northern Idaho, with an emphasis on their characteristics and construction. The history of their presence in the Idaho Panhandle National Forests is also covered.

1986 *Ranger Stations on the Idaho Panhandle National Forests*. Idaho Panhandle National Forests, Coeur d'Alene, Idaho.

This source addresses the development of early Forest Service administration sites in the Idaho Panhandle National Forests. Included is an analysis of the need for the construction of early Ranger Stations and other administrative buildings on federal land, and the changing architecture (and associated costs) of such buildings through time. An inventory of all known examples of early Ranger Stations on the Idaho Panhandle is also included.

2002 *Albert Klockmann, the Continental Mine and the Boundary Creek Road: A Chronology*. File No. 1220. Idaho Panhandle National Forests. Coeur d'Alene, Idaho.

This report is an archival review and analysis of the development of the Continental Mine and construction of the Boundary Creek Road. It includes numerous historical maps, articles and photographs pertaining to Klockmann, the Continental Mine, and Boundary Creek Road.

Smith, Allan H.

1985 *An Ethnographic-Ethnohistorical Guide to Archaeological Sites in the Kalispel Territory: Part III Albeni Falls, Washington, to Heron, Montana, Sector*. Unpublished draft.

This unpublished, partial draft represents a substantial record of research conducted since the 1950's into some of the earliest and most obscure resources available regarding the history and dispersal of aboriginal populations across the Kalispel Territory. It provides great insight, while simultaneously containing sensitive geographical information regarding known (and possible) archaeological sites in the region.

Smith, Kris R. (Ed.)

2007 *Pioneer Voices of Priest Lake*. Keokee Publishing. Sandpoint, ID.

A collection of oral histories recounted by the earliest residents of the Priest Lake area. Some topics include mining, logging, Sourdoughs, Nell Shipman, homesteading, CCC, the Forest Reserve, and transportation.

This report contains the transcripts of interviews with early IPNF settlers and administration. Included are interviews with: Henry Janusch, Ole Jennestad, Fred Murphy, Frank McPhearson, Henry Kottkey, Donald Peterson, Harold Theriault, Dooley Cramp, Alice Carnie, Maidell Clements, and Fred Murphy.

This book contains many references to mining, logging, and weather in the Kaniksu National Forest from 1899 forward. Some specific topics covered include Big Blow, Prater Mountain Ranch & Halfway House, and the Klockman Diary.

This collection contains the manuscripts of Priest Lake pioneer Harriet Allen Klein (MS 137, Final 2E4). Memoir highlights include, mining, roads, and highways of the Priest Lake region. Dates covered range from 1887-1986, with the bulk of the collection ranging from 1925-1946.

This collection contains various references to the Bartoo family, as well as the history of Bartoo Island. Highlights include newspaper clippings and an extensive transcript of an interview with George Bartoo by Allegra Askman on September 15, 1975(OH 58 EWSHS). Based on Klockmann's diary and memoirs, this book represents a closer look at the history of the Continental Mine, and more specifically covers Klockmann's life in more detail than earlier publications. Contains many photographs of Klockmann and family, as well as the operations at the Continental.

This compilation contains a detailed history of the use, building techniques, and present condition of all known fire lookouts in the Pacific Northwest, including those in the Idaho Panhandle National Forest. Highlights include many older pictures.

Fromme's principle task on this job was to run the compass course and a description of his work in the field is described in detail. The snug little log cabin where Michael Murray and his mail-order bride from Minnesota made their first home was a one-room structure with fireplace and entrance door on one side and a double floor-bed of corn fodder, hay and cedar boughs, opposite, along with sacks of flour, sugar, stacks of canned goods in corner at its foot. Sleeping arrangements that this new Forest Assistant from Ohio State and Yale endured are humorously remembered and written. The cruising job took about two weeks and than Fromme headed for home on his un-trusty "bear paws", his snow shoes. On his way he encountered the dam-tender, a good-hearted "old skate" by logging lingo. He tended the dam at the Falls for river-driving Fidelity Company logs. Fromme was invited to his dam-shack where he was given "hot alcohol" for his sore-throat condition. After leaving the dam-shack, the conversations held with the dam-tender fresh in his memory, the miles seemed easier but the exuberance disappeared before reaching his destination. There his future mother-in-law proclaimed that Fromme had "quincy" and put him on a train headed for the nearest doctor for treatment, located in Newport, WA. Diary of James R. Gillis, Pend Oreille, 1913; "Looking Backwards," 1903-1910. 40 pages. Pend Oreille National Forest. Every day of the week accounted for in this diary, even Sundays and legal holidays indicated. Just a few of the examples: July 16, Went to Heron to finish working up the Elk Creek timber reconnaissance; JULY 17, Van Dyke and Loughborough went on to Clarks Fork, Gillis stayed in Heron, looking up market data; August 18, Sunday. Bonners Ferry all day; August 19, Came to Sand Point on G. M. Dinkey. Find Barton ready to leave for Kentucky. Worked on Elk Creek maps all day. Names and places mentioned in connection with Reconnaissance work: Antelope Mountain, Addie, Sam Howell, Summit, Skin Creek, Beck's cabin, Eastport, Mitchell's, Ryan, Snyder,

Lundstrom, Mason, Keeler Creek, Hooker, Meadow Creek and many others. Memorandum to Heads Of Department Agencies from Charles F. Brannan, Secretary, U.S. Department of Agriculture about his reluctant acceptance of request for retirement of William A. Jump because of failing health. Mr. Brannan is sending a copy of that request to each Head to read it who is interested in better public administration. Mr. Brannan is also including a glowing praise from the President on Mr. Jump's years of service. Memorandum to Hon. Charles F. Brannan, Secretary of Agriculture dated November 30, 1948, from W. A. Jump, Director of Finance. In his memo Mr. Jump requests disability retirement because of rapidly failing health after spending 42 years at the Department. He lists and describes the factors that he found during his years that made the Department so great in what it was and had accomplished. Letter to Mr. Jump from President Harry S. Truman, The White House, Washington, dated December 21, 1948 in which the President states feeling a deep sense of loss upon hearing that Mr. Jump is retiring from government service. He mentions Mr. Jump being a symbol of high standard of public service that is being followed by many of his associates and others that follow will profit by his example.
