Abstract

This **2004 Land and Resource Management Plan (2004 Forest Plan)** was prepared according to Department of Agriculture regulations (36 CFR 219) which are based on the Forest and Rangeland Renewable Resources Planning Act (RPA), as amended by the National Forest Management Act of 1976 (NFMA). This plan was also developed in accordance with regulations (40 CFR 1500) for implementing the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA).

Because this 2004 Forest Plan is considered a major federal action significantly affecting the environment, a detailed **final environmental impact statement** (FEIS) has been prepared as required by NEPA and 36 CFR 219. If any provision of this plan or its application to any person or circumstances is found to be invalid, the remainder of the plan and its applicability to other persons or circumstances will not be affected.
