This map displays alternatives 1 and 3. There would be no additions to the National Forest Transportation System (NFTS) under these alternatives. Existing NFTS roads and motorized trails that are open to public use are displayed. For reference purposes only, the map also shows private roads (see legend).

Alternative 1: No Action - No Change to NFTS and Continue Cross-Country Travel. Under this alternative, cross-country travel would not be prohibited except in wilderness areas. Existing season of use restrictions apply to NFTS and below the high-water mark on the reservoirs. The areas open and closed to cross-country motor vehicle travel identified in the 1995 Shasta-Trinity National Forest Land and Resource Management Plan were not formally adopted with Forest Orders.

Alternative 3: Cross-Country Travel Prohibition Only - No Additions to the Existing NFTS. Alternative 3 complies with the Travel Management Rule requirement to prohibit motor vehicle travel off of designated NFTS roads, trails and areas. No additions to the NFTS are proposed under this alternative and cross-country motor vehicle travel, including below the high-water mark of reservoirs, would be prohibited.



