Firewood Available to Woodcutters

Firewood is available for cutting with a valid woodcutting permit near the Bald Rock Dome Trailhead. The available firewood is located a half-mile west of the trailhead on Bean Creek Road, about 3.5 miles SE of Brush Creek or 6 miles NE of Hwy 162 (Oroville-Quincy Hwy) near the town of Berry Creek (Township 21, Range 6, Section 30).

Woodcutting permits are \$10 a cord (maximum of 10 cords) and are available at the Feather River Ranger District, 875 Mitchell Avenue, Oroville, CA 95965, and at other Plumas National Forest District offices. Maps of the area are also available.

Decks of large Ponderosa pine and standing Tan oak trees were burned in the Canyon Complex fires during the summer of 2008. Trees marked with green paint and unmarked dead trees near the roads are available to cut.
