Hazard Tree Removal on Dome Trail

The Redding Smoke Jumpers will be removing dangerous hazard trees in the Bald Rock Dome Trail area beginning on Monday, April 19 through Thursday, April 22, from 8am to 4:30pm daily. There will be traffic control starting at the large landing where Bean Creek Road intersects with Forest Service Road 21N36 and 21N71 continuing down to the Bald Rock Dome Trailhead. Access will be limited, so please plan accordingly.

During the Friend-Darnell Fire of 2008, many large trees were burned. In order to maintain safety for forest visitors, the dead snags need to be removed from the area as soon as possible.
