

ORDER NO.3  
WILDERNESS AREAS - OCCUPANCY AND USE  
SAN BERNARDINO NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a) and I(b) each of the following acts are prohibited on the identified areas under my jurisdiction.

1. Not having a shovel or hand trowel in possession for burying human waste and fire control during overnight camping. 36 CFR 261.52(g)
2. Short cutting a switchback. 36 CFR 261.55(d)
3. Disposing of debris, garbage or other waste. 36 CFR 261.57(g)
4. Camping or picketing stock within 200 feet of meadows, springs, streams, trails or other occupied camps. 36 CFR 261.58(aa)
5. Camping within one quarter mile of Dollar Lake. 36 CFR 261.58(e)
6. Camping at the same campsite for more than two nights in the South Fork drainage per party per trip. Including Township 1N, Range 1E, Sections 23, 24, 25, 26, 35 and 36. 36 CFR 261.58(e)
7. Explorer camping in the South Fork drainage. 36 CFR 261.58(e)
8. Using a trail, campsite, or other area by an explorer group larger than eight persons. 36 CFR 261.58(f)
9. Use of a campsite at other than yellow post sites. 36 CFR 261.52(a)
10. Possessing or use of any wheeled mechanical device including on trails which lead to Wilderness Areas. 36 CFR 261.57(h)
11. Possessing or transporting a animal, off of a leash. 36 CFR 261.58(s)

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), each of the following persons is exempt from this order:

1. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
2. person(s) with authorization or a permit.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR, Part 261.
