

ORDER NO.1
OCCUPANCY AND USE -DEVELOPED SITES SAN BERNARDINO NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (a) and (b) each of the following acts are prohibited in the identified areas under my jurisdiction:

1. Camping in developed recreation sites for more than 14 days. 261.58a
2. Unauthorized occupancy of reserved sites. 261.58b
3. Use of a campsite by more than 1 family or with more than eight people unless the site is designated for group use, 261.58f
4. Being publicly nude. 261.58j
5. Being in the area between 10 PM and 6 AM except for a person who is camping or visiting a person in the camping area. 261.58u
6. Being on the grounds or in the buildings of the organization camp known as Camp Little Green Valley. 261.54b
7. Occupying, for any purpose in a designated threatened and endangered species habitat area. 261.53a
8. Entering or being in Jenks Lake except for the designated swimming area. 261.58k
9. Possessing/operating a motorboat on Jenks Lake. 261.58n
10. Entering or using any NF site by minors in violation of County School and Curfew regulations. 261.58b
11. Possessing a beverage, defined as alcoholic beverage by State Law within the Forest Falls Recreation Area. 261.58bb (For the purposes of this Order, the Forest Falls Recreation Area shall be defined as all National Forest lands within 50 yds of the canyon floor between private land parcels in Section 16 and 17, Township IS, Range IE and 50 yds of the stream bed from Big Falls Trailhead to Big Falls.)

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (e), each of the following persons is exempt from this order:

1. Any Federal, State or Local Officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
2. person(s) with authorization or a permit. These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR, Part 261.
