

ORDER NO. 04-1
TEMPORARY CLOSURE
SAN BERNARDINO NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), and to protect public safety and natural resources, the following acts is prohibited within the San Bernardino National Forest. This Order is effective from January 14, 2004, through December 31, 2004.

- a. Using or possessing a motorized vehicle on the National Forest System roads listed below and shown on the attached map. 36 CFR 261.54(a).
 1. Forest Road 3N31 from the boundary of the San Bernardino National Forest to its intersection with Forest Road 2N53, and the segment of Forest Road 3N31 from its intersection with Forest Road 2N56 to its intersection with Forest Road 3N29.
 2. Forest Road 1N32 from the boundary of the San Bernardino National Forest to its intersection with Forest Road 3N31.
 3. Forest Road 1N33 from the gate located 1 mile East of Lytle Creek Road to its intersection with Forest Road 3N31.
 4. Forest Road 2N79 from Lytle Creek Road to its intersection with Forest Road 3N31.
 5. Forest Road 2N57 from Old Lytle Creek Road to its intersection with Forest Road 3N31.
 6. Forest Road 2N53 from Applewhite Campground to its intersection with Forest Road 2N52.
 7. Forest Road 2N52.
 8. Forest Road 2N58 from the gate located above the Middlefork special use tract to its termination point.
 9. Forest Road 2N49 from Palm Avenue to its intersection with Silverwood State Park Boundary.
 10. Forest Road 2N40 (Cloudland Truck Trail) from Devil's Canyon Road to its intersection with Highway 18.
 11. Forest Road 2N30 from Highway 18 to its intersection with Forest Road 2N40.

12. Forest Road 1N36 (Bullock Spur) from the boundary of the San Bernardino National Forest to its intersection with Forest Road 1N34.
13. Forest Road 1N34 (Sansevaine Road) from Lytle Creek Road to its intersection with Skyline Road.
14. Forest Road 1N35 from Forest Road 1N34 to Stoddard Canyon.
15. Forest Road 1N13 from Greenspot Road to its intersection with Forest Road 1N09.
16. Forest Road 1N16 from Greenspot Road to its intersection with Forest Road 1N09.
17. Forest Road 1N21 from the boundary of the San Bernardino National Forest to its intersection with Forest Road 1N09.
18. Forest Road 1N22 from Highway 330 to the boundary of the San Bernardino National Forest.
19. Forest Road 1N24 from Highway 18 to its intersection with Forest Road 1N22.
20. Forest Road 1N25 from the boundary of the San Bernardino National Forest to its intersection with Forest Road 1N22.
21. Forest Road 3N34 from Highway 173 to its intersection with Forest Trail 2W07.
22. Forest Road 2N24Y from Lovers Lane to its intersection with Ridge Road.
23. Forest Road 2N31.
24. Forest Road 2N75.
25. Forest Road 2N96.
26. Forest Road 2N25 from Torey Road to its intersection with Forest Road 3N34.
27. Forest Road 2N26Y.
28. Forest Road 2N23.
29. Forest Road 2N63.
30. Forest Road 2N03 from Highway 138 to its intersection with Burnt Mill Canyon Road.

31. Forest Road 2N43.
 32. Forest Road 2N59 from County Road U7311 to its intersection with Forest Road 2N49.
 33. Forest Road 2N45 from Highway 138 to its intersection with Forest Road 2N59.
 34. Forest Road 2N47.
 34. Forest Road 2N33 from Cedar Springs Dam Road to its intersection with Forest Road 2N36.
- b. Using or possessing a motorized vehicle on the National Forest System Trails listed below and shown on the attached map. 36 CFR 261.55(b).
1. Forest Off-Highway Vehicle Route 2W01.
 2. Forest Off-Highway Vehicle Route 3W14.

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
2. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act.
3. Owners or lessees of land in the area or visitors of owners or lessees of land in the area are exempt from the prohibitions listed above to the extent necessary to gain access to the owners or lessees' land.
4. Residents in the area or visitors of residents in the area are exempt from the prohibitions listed above to the extent necessary to gain access to the residence in question.
5. Employees and sub-contractors of contractors and public utility companies who are engaged in operations authorized by the Forest Service.

6. Persons with disabilities using assistive devices or aids. An assistive device is a piece of equipment, such as a wheelchair, used by a person with a disability on a daily basis to help in the accomplishment of one of life's major functions or activities. A wheelchair is defined in the Americans with Disabilities Act to be "a device designed solely for use by a mobility-impaired person for locomotion, that is suitable for use in an indoor pedestrian area". 42 USC 12207(c)(2).

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months or both. 16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559, 3571, and 3581.
