ORDER
Occupancy and Use Restrictions
San Juan, Rio Grande, Grand Mesa, Uncompahgre and Gunnison
National Forests

Pursuant to Title 16 United States Code ("USC") section 551, and Title 36 Code of Federal Regulations ("CFR") section 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on National Forest System lands administered by the San Juan, Rio Grand, Grand Mesa, Uncompahgre, and/or Gunnison National Forests in the State of Colorado (the "restricted area"). This Order is supplemental to and does not rescind or replace those restrictions at 36 CFR 261 Subpart A, and/or any Forest Supervisor Order issued under 36 CFR 261 Subpart B. This Order is necessary to protect public health and safety and to provide the public with consistent public health and safety restrictions in the restricted area.

PROHIBITIONS:

To go into or be upon the restricted area while in possession of drug paraphernalia, as defined by Colorado Revised Statute (CRS). 36 CFR 261.53(e)

To go into or be upon the restricted area while in possession of a controlled substance, unless such substance was obtained by the possessor pursuant to a valid prescription or order, from a licensed medical practitioner acting in the course of professional practice, or as otherwise allowed by Federal. 36 CFR 261.53(e)


"Controlled substance" means a drug or other substance, or immediate precursor, included in schedules I, II, III, IV, or V of Part B of the Controlled Substances Act (21 U.S.C. § 812) or a drug or substance added to these schedules pursuant to the terms of the Act.

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order.


1. Any Federal, State, or local officer in the performance of an official duty.

This Order shall be in effect from until December 31, 2012, or rescinded, whichever event occurs first
