

ORDER

VEHICLE USE AND OCCUPANCY AND USE RESTRICTIONS

ARAPAHO NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (a), the following acts are prohibited in the Winter Park Ski Area, as described in this order, within the Arapaho National Forest, until further notice:

- I. Going into or be upon the area described below commencing November 1 and ending April 30, for the protection of public health or safety. Exhibit A. 36 CFR 261.53.

The area closed is a portion of the Winter Park Ski Area (WPRA) administrative boundary 25 feet in width along the tops of Parsenn Bowl and Vasquez Cirque. The closure begins at a signed access point east of Vasquez Mountain, continues 13,200 feet south and east along the ridge top to North Cone Peak; to a WPRA internal access gate located south of North Cone Peak; the closure continues 6500 feet east along the south ridge of Parsenn Bowl and Sweedes Ridge terminating at a signed access point at the nose of the ridge between Parsenn and Zero Creek drainages. Located in the east 1/2 of Section 28, T2S, R75W, 6th Principle meridian.

- II. Possessing or using any motorized vehicle off Forest Development Roads. Exhibit B. 36 CFR 261.56.

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or Local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
