The following acts are prohibited in the Cloud Peak Wilderness.

- 1. Entering or being in the Cloud Peak Wilderness without current required registration signed and in the possession of the group or individual.**
2. Building, maintaining, attending or using a campfire, other than a self-contained chemical stove above 9200 feet in elevation.
3. Below 9200 feet in elevation campfires must be contained on a fireblanket or within a fire pan or enclosed stove so as not to be directly on the ground.
4. Building, maintaining, attending or using a campfire within 300 feet of lakes, streams, or Forest Service designated trails.
5. Possessing, storing, or transporting any part of a tree including branches, limbs or trunk above 9200 feet in elevation.
6. Camping within 100 feet of all lakes, streams or other free flowing waters.
7. Hitching, tethering, restraining or hobbling a horse or other saddle or pack animal to a live tree, except while loading or unloading.
8. Hitching, tethering, restraining or hobbling a horse or other pack animal within 100 feet of lakes or streams, except while loading or unloading.
9. Failure to dispose of debris, garbage, or other waste including camp structures such as hitching racks, tent frames, and pegs after the use period.
- 10. Using the Cloud Peak Wilderness with a group larger than 10 people and/or with more than 15 head of recreational stock in any group, larger groups than permitted must split into separate groups which meet the group size limits and must remain a minimum of 1/2 mile apart even at campsites. Groups may have an additional 2 people in their group if a member of the group is trained in "Leave No Trace" outdoor skills and ethics and has a copy of their certification with them.**
11. Short cutting a switchback in a trail.
12. Possessing or using a wagon, cart, wheelbarrow, bicycle, or other vehicle (including "game carts")
13. (New in 2013) Failure to dispose of solid human waste in the West and Middle Tensleep drainages portions of Cloud Peak wilderness by packing it out and disposing off of the Bighorn National Forest in an approved waste disposal facility.
14. Camping in violation of posted instructions.
