

Administrative Correction #3 March 8, 2007

Administrative corrections are defined at 36 CFR 219.7(b) and may be made at any time. They are not plan amendments or revisions.

Administrative corrections include the following: (1) Corrections and updates of data and maps; (2) Corrections of typographical errors or other non-substantive changes; (3) Changes in the monitoring program and monitoring information; (4) Changes in timber management projections; and (5) Other changes in the Plan Document or Set of Documents, except for substantive changes in the plan components.

Plan Chapter 1 (36CFR 219.7(b)(2) other non-substantive changes)

Current Plan: Page 1-7, Water and Aquatic Standard 8 reads – Maintain enough water in perennial streams to sustain existing stream health. Return some water to dewatered perennial streams when needed and feasible.”

Administrative Correction: New wording for Water and Aquatic Standard 8 - Manage stream flows under appropriate authorities to minimize damage to scenic and aesthetic values, fish and wildlife habitat, and to otherwise protect the environment.

Current Plan: Water and Aquatic Standard 14 reads – Maintain enough additional water in streams to sustain the water dependent recreation values. Generally, standard #8 provides for most recreation –related water uses, but additional water may be needed for special recreation features and heavy use recreation areas.

Administrative Correction: Delete Water and Aquatic Standard 14.

Current Plan: Water and Aquatic Guideline 1 reads – Protect instream flows at outstanding recreation features. Such features include designated/study wild, scenic, or recreational rivers; stream segments used for commercial boating; stream segments having developed recreation sites or vistas; and national recreation historic/scenic trails or scenic byways from which the segments are clearly visible. Protection of water quantity and quality is vital to recreation experiences. Refer to Table 1-6 in FEIS Appendix I for listing of sites with outstanding recreation features.

Administrative Correction: Water and Aquatic Guideline 1 - Incorporate appropriate practices and design criteria from the Watershed Conservation Practices Handbook (FSH 2509.25) into all project design, analysis, and decision documents.

Current Plan: Water and Aquatic Guideline 2 reads – For existing dams and diversions where water is being bypassed or returned to the stream and is available for recreation and aesthetic uses, secure and maintain these flows where needed.

Administrative Correction: Delete Water and Aquatic Guideline 2.

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Current Plan: Water and Aquatic Guideline 3 reads – For new dams and diversions, obtain bypass flows at the point of diversion or stage that protects water dependent recreation value.

Administrative Correction: Delete Water and Aquatic Guideline 3.
