

**ORDER
EMERGENCY FIRE CLOSURE
KAIBAB NATIONAL FOREST**

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. 551, and 36 CFR § 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on all National Forest System lands within the Kaibab National Forest, in the Coconino County in the state of Arizona. The restricted area is depicted on the attached map, hereby incorporated into this Order as Exhibit A.

PROHIBITION:

Going into or being upon the restricted area; 36 CFR § 261.52(e)

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this closure order:

1. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State or Local Officer or member of an organized firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

AREA DESCRIPTION:

This Order applies to National Forest System lands, roads and trails within the vicinity of Sitgreaves Mountain and Spring Valley. The northern boundary of the closed area can be described as Forest Road 97 east to Forest Road 141 south to the junction of Forest Road 76 and continuing south to Forest Road 104. At this point an obvious fire dozer line will be closed to the junction of Forest Road 522 continuing north to the junction of Forest Road 97.

PURPOSE:

This Order is necessary to protect public health and safety due to ongoing wildfire and fire suppression activities on the Eagle Rock Fire.

IMPLEMENTATION:

1. This Order will be in effect when signed and shall remain in effect until July 28, 2010 or until rescinded, whichever ever occurs first.
2. This Order rescinds, replaces and supersedes any previous Orders prohibiting the same acts covered by this Order in that area addressed in Exhibit A
