

**ORDER OF THE FOREST SUPERVISOR
CLOSING AN AREA TO ENTRY, TO WIT:**

OCCUPANCY AND USE

WAYNE NATIONAL FOREST - OHIO

Under the authority of the Act of Congress dated June 4, 1897, as amended (16 U.S.C. 551), and pursuant to the Secretary of Agriculture's Regulations set forth at 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart B (36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b)), the following acts and omissions are prohibited on the Wayne National Forest:

1. Camping in excess of 14 continuous days at any one campsite and/or relocating a camp within 1500 feet of the site last occupied. 36 CFR 261.58(a)
2. Entering or using a developed recreation site or portion thereof when posted closed. 36 CFR 261.58(b)
3. Entering or remaining in a campground between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. in violation of a posted sign, except for persons who are occupying such campgrounds. 36 CFR 261.58(c)
4. Occupying a developed recreation site with prohibited camping equipment. 36 CFR 261.58(d)
5. Using a developed campsite by more than eight (8) users unless authorized by permit. 36 CFR 261.58(f)
6. Parking or leaving a vehicle in violation of posted instructions. 36 CFR 261.58(g)
7. Parking or leaving a vehicle outside a parking space assigned to one's own camp unit. 36 CFR 261.58(h)
8. Possessing, parking or leaving more than two vehicles, except motorcycles or bicycles, per camp unit. 36 CFR 261.58(i)
9. Being publicly nude. 36 CFR 261.58(j)
10. Operating a motorboat, other than electric powered, on waters posted closed to motorboats. 36 CFR 261.58(n)
11. Storing or leaving a boat or raft. 36 CFR 261.58(p)


THESE RESTRICTIONS ARE NECESSARY FOR PUBLIC SAFETY AND TO PROTECT NATIONAL FOREST PROPERTY. THEY ARE IN ADDITION TO THE GENERAL PROHIBITIONS SET FORTH IN 36 CFR PART 261. THIS ORDER WILL TERMINATE FIVE YEARS FORM THE DATE OF SIGNATURE UNLESS WITHDRAWN BY TERMINATION ORDER OF THE FOREST SUPERVISOR.

Pursuant to the provision of 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission (36 CFR 261.50(e)(1)); and,
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty (36 CFR 261.50(e)(4)).

Violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 for an individual or \$10,000.00 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or both (16 U.S.C. 551, 18 U.S. C. 3559 and 3571).
