

ORDER

PERMITS REQUIRED FOR CAVE ENTRY
LINCOLN NATIONAL FOREST
USDA - FOREST SERVICE

Pursuant to Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations Parts 261.50 (a), the following prohibition is placed on all caves within the areas administered by the Lincoln National Forest.


Entering a cave without a permit (Closed for the protection of objects or areas of historical, archeological, geological, or paleontological interest). 36 CFR 261.53 (c)

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (e), each of the following persons is exempt from this order.

(1) Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act.

(2) Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force, in the performance of a official duty.

This Order of Prohibition is done at Alamogordo, New Mexico, this 3 day of MARCH, 1992.

Violation of this prohibition, or the conditions of any permit issued thereunder, is punishable by a fine of not more than \$500.00, or imprisonment for not more that six months, or both. (16 USC 551)
