YEOMAN PARK - FULFORD AREA

ACCESS: Follow Brush Creek Road, FDR 400, 10.1 miles south of Eagle to the end of the pavement. Turn left onto East Brush Creek Road, FDR 415 and drive 5.7 miles to Yeoman Park. East Brush Creek Road is usually maintained by Eagle County as far as Yeoman Park. Before traveling this or any Forest winter access route call the county road department at (970) 328-3540 for road condition information. Roads opened for recreation purposes receive low priority maintenance. Winter travelers should be fully briefed on weather reports and prepared for snow emergencies.

ATTRACTIONS AND CONSIDERATIONS: Yeoman Park opens a wide expanse and variety of terrain to the snowmobiler. Hat Creek Road, FDR 416, begins at the Yeoman Park Campground and runs to the ridge top between Spine and Hat Creek. The trip can be extended down Spine Creek Road and back to the Brush Creek Road, FDR 400, above Sylvan Lake.

Nolan Creek Road, FDR 419, to the historic Fulford area is also popular with snowmobilers operating out of Yeoman Park.

The area out of Yeoman Park contains critical winter range for big game herds. State law forbids disturbing, harassing, pursuing or chasing any wildlife with a snowmachine. Winter travelers should be aware that the sight of man puts tremendous stress on big game. The stress burns a large number of calories which the animals have a difficult time replacing under winter range conditions.
