GILLEY LAKE TRAIL # 1833

Difficulty: Moderate

Trail Use: Moderate

Length: 6/10 of a mile

Elevation: Starts at 8,733 feet and ends at 8,314 feet (highest point 8,733 feet)

Elevation Gain: + 0 feet – 419 feet = - 419 feet

Open To: HIKING, HORSEBACK RIDING

Access:

- The Gilley Lake Trail is located 29 miles southeast of Meeker.
- From Meeker, take State Highway 13 east for 1 mile.
- Where Highway 13 turns north, turn east on Rio Blanco County Road 8 for 20 miles.
- Turn south on the Buford-New Castle Road (RBC Rd 17 to forest boundary, then FDR 245) for 8 miles to the Gilley Lake Trail.

Trail Highlights:

Gilley Lake is one in the group of lakes that make up the Seven Lakes Lodge Guest Ranch. It is the only lake of the seven on the National Forest.


