LONG PARK TRAIL # 1809

Difficulty: More Difficult

Trail Use: Light

Length: 2 miles

Elevation: Starts at 7,614 feet and ends at 8,711 feet (highest point 8,714 feet)

Elevation Gain: +1,202 feet – 105 feet = +1,097 feet

Open To: HIKING, HORSEBACK RIDING (From 6/15—9/1 only, open to motorcycles)

Access:

- The Long Park Trail is located 32 miles east of Meeker.
- From Meeker, take State Highway 13 east for 1 mile.
- Where Highway 13 turns north, turn east on Rio Blanco County Road 8 for 31 miles.
- The Long-Lost Trailhead is on north side of the road just before the Lost Creek Guard Station. Parking is available on the south side of CR 8.

Trail Highlights:

The Long Park Trail connects to the Deadhorse-Long Park Loop four-wheel drive road #230. It also connects with Lost Park Road #231 which, from 6/15—9/1 only, is open to ATVs as well as motorcycles. From the trailhead you climb rapidly for 1/2 mile to the northeast until reaching the crest of the ridge between the White River and Long Park Creek drainages. Views of the surrounding area can be enjoyed as you travel through scrub oak and aspen along the ridge for 1.2 miles. The trail follows Long Park Creek for the next 1.6 miles into the meadows of Long Park to the junction of Road #230 and #231.
