SNOWMOBILING

6 - SWAN VALLEY WINTER RECREATION AREA

Difficulty: MODERATE

Trail Use: Moderate

Length: Varies depending on trail

Elevation: Varies depending on trail

Elevation Gain: Varies depending on trail

Open To: SNOWMOBILING, CROSS-COUNTRY, SNOWSHOEING

Access:

- From I-70 take Exit 203, Frisco / Breckenridge, and travel south on HWY 9 through Frisco and travel to Breckenridge. Turn left at the intersection of Tiger Road (County Road 6) and HWY 9.
- Travel east on Tiger Road for approximately 4.17 miles to the end of the plowed road. Park in the designated area.

- From the North Fork of the Swan you can ride to the top of Wise Mountain, elevation 12,052 feet.
- From the Middle Fork of the Swan snowmobilers can travel to the top of the Continental Divide, elevation 12,624 feet, near Sheep Mountain.
- From the South Fork of the Swan snowmobile riders can travel to the top of the Continental Divide at Georgia Pass, elevation 11,585 feet.

Important Information:

- **THESE ROADS ARE USED FOR MULTIPLE ACTIVITIES TO INCLUDE SNOWMOBILING, CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING AND SNOWSHOEING. PLEASE RESPECT OTHER USERS.**
- A large portion of this area is above timberline. For this reason, be sure to check the weather forecast and choose a clear day for your trip.
- Private snowmobile guides also run their tours in this area. Some of their trails may be groomed.
- Although this area is open to the public, as well as the permitted guide services, please be considerate of the guides' trail work and their tours.
