## INDIANA CREEK ROAD - FDR 593

**Difficulty:** MODERATE

**Trail Use:** Low

**Length:** 1.8 miles one-way to Boreas Pass Road

**Elevation:** Starts at 10,413 feet and ends at 11,195 feet (highest point 11,195 feet)

**Elevation Gain:** +782 feet - 0 feet = +782 feet

**Open In Summer To:** HIKING, HORSE, MTN. BIKING, 4X4, ATV, MOTORCYCLE

**Open In Winter To:** X-C SKIING, SNOWSHOEING

### Access:

- From I-70 take Exit 203, Frisco / Breckenridge, and travel south on HWY 9 toward Breckenridge.
- Continue through Breckenridge and travel approximately 1.0 mile past the last traffic light in Breckenridge at Boreas Pass Road. Turn left at Wagon Road from HWY 9 (if you travel past the Goose Pasture Tarn [lake] you have gone too far).
- Travel on Wagon Road and turn left onto Indiana Creek Road (FDR 593). When you come to the fork in the road bear to the left and continue on Indiana Creek Road. When the paved road ends, this will be the beginning of the OHV portion of Indiana Creek Road.
- **Seasonal Closure:** Indiana Creek Rd is closed to motor vehicles Nov. 23-May 20 or until road is dry.

### Trail Highlights:

- Indiana Creek Road is a pleasant road up to Boreas Pass Road (County Road 10), which can then take you back toward Breckenridge (left) or over Boreas Pass to Como in Park County (right).
- You can also travel to the old mining town of Dyersville and the Warriors Mark Mine. Travel approximately 1.3 miles from the beginning of the unpaved portion of Indiana Creek Road and bear right on the road to Dyersville (FDR 597). Dyersville is approximately 0.2 miles on the left. The Warriors Mark mine is another 0.1 miles further. Turn left and the mine will be straight ahead. *Please be careful around Dyersville and the Warriors Mark Mine.*
- Another popular route involves making a loop from Indiana Creek Road to Pennsylvania Creek Road (FDR 611) which will take you back down to HWY 9. Turn right on Pennsylvania Creek Road after traveling approximately 0.5 mile on the dirt portion of Indiana Creek Road. Follow Pennsylvania Creek Road for 5 miles to HWY 9 and turn right to return to the beginning of Indiana Creek Road.

### Important Information:

- Off-highway vehicles must be registered with Colorado State Parks. Out-of-state residents who bring OHVs into Colorado must purchase a Colorado Non-Resident OHV permit.
- **STAY ON DESIGNATED ROADS TO PREVENT RESOURCE DAMAGE.**
- Horses not recommended on this road due to motorized use.
- Private land exists near the beginning of this route. Please respect all private property.
