Dutch Fire Update

Yreka, CA – Thanks to the impressive work accomplished in the past few days by the dedicated fire fighters assigned to the Dutch Fire, managers feel confident that the fire will not grow any larger and the fire lines are becoming more secure. Most of the burning material near the containment lines has been extinguished and crews will carefully walk this area today to monitor and mop-up any hot spots. Plans are being made to transition the remaining work needed to reach control objectives back to the Klamath National Forest tonight. The Incident Command Post located at the Collier Rest Stop along I-5 will no longer be needed to support major fire suppression activities and will reopen to the public soon.

The fire has not increased in size and is being held at 371 acres of burned area. Fire hose is being removed from fire lines where is it no longer required and fire suppression repair work is being completed today. Most of the 20-person hand crews have been reassigned to other fires or released back to their home station for rest and possible re-deployment. The Dutch Fire is considered 90% contained this morning and it is anticipated to be declared fully contained by 6:00 p.m. today.

No lost-time injuries have been reported and no structures have been damaged by the fire.
