

From Big Rapids -

- Travel west on M-20 for 8.5 miles.
- Turn right and travel north on Cypress Ave. for .5 miles.
- Turn right and travel east on Hungerford Lake Dr. for .5 miles.
- Turn left and travel north on Forest Rd. 5134:
- Mountain Bike Trailhead: go .25 miles. Site is on the left.
- Boat Launch and Campsites: go .5 miles. Site is located on the left.
- Horse Trail Camp: go 1 mile. Site is located on the left.
- Horse Trailhead: go 1.5 miles. Site is on the left.

* - indicates a Recreation Enhancement Act Fee Pass is required at this site.

Recreation Enhancement Act Fee

Recreation fees help pay for the facilities and services that you will be using.

You can deposit the fee at the site or you can choose to purchase from a variety of recreation passes. The two main types are the America the Beautiful Interagency Pass or the Huron-Manistee National Forests Recreation Pass.

Trail and Area Management

- Do not cut switchbacks, stay on trail.
- Do not make new trails.
- Horses are not allowed on the mountain bike trail.
- Please observe all posted closures.

Multiple Use Recreation

Day Use Trailheads: There are trailheads for mountain biking and for horses. See map for locations. A toilet is located at the horse trailhead.

Horseback Riding: Trails are marked with solid blue diamonds and blue diamonds with a horse symbol. Trail segments are marked with white numbers on blue diamonds.

Mountain Biking: Trails are marked with plain yellow diamonds, blue diamonds with a bike symbol, and yellow diamonds with black arrows.

Camping: Camping is available at the Hungerford Lake. Water is available at the main campground, group campsite and Hungersford Lake. Water is available at the main campground.

Boating/Fishing: A 30-acre lake offers fishing and boating opportunities. A boat launch is located on the north side of the lake.

Skiing: Visitors can ski on any trails or roads in the area. Roads and trails are not groomed in the winter.

Hiking: Hiking is available on all trails.

Motorized Travel: ORVs are allowed on roads and trails designated for that use. See the Motor Vehicle Use Map for more information.

Conduct and Ethics

Campground Camping -

- Campgrounds open from March 15 to November 15. All sites first come, first served. Water is available at the main campground.
- Overnight visits limited to a 14-day period per stay.
- Campsites must be occupied the first night of a stay and every 24 hours thereafter.
- Generators may be used from 6 a.m. to 10 p.m.
- Each campsite is limited to 2 vehicles and 8 people and A) 1 Horse Trailer and 1 Camping Unit or B) 2 Camping Units (See chart on information board).
- Dogs must be leashed in campgrounds.

Dispersed Camping -

- Dispersed camping is allowed. No camping in areas posted closed.
- Campsites must be 150 feet from roads and trails and 200 feet from water.

Group Campsite -

- Contact Recreation.gov at 1-877-444-6777 for reservations.

Campfires -

- Use only dead and down wood for personal campfires.
- Firewood collection is limited to personal use on Forest Service lands without a permit.

Horses

- must be tied to picket poles in the campground;
- cannot be tied directly to trees;
- are not allowed in Hungerford Lake, Ewing Creek, or other bodies of water.
- Building of corrals in campground is prohibited.
