


Using Mapwel's MapUpload to Install the Dixie National Forest Travel Map on Your Garmin GPS

NOTE: The Mapwel maps are not compatible with all GPS units. Do not attempt to use the software or provided map if your unit is not specifically mentioned at <http://www.mapwel.eu/features.htm> . Attempting to load data into a unit that it is not intended may render the unit inoperable and would need to be sent to Garmin for repair.

1. Run MAPUPLOAD.exe
2. Click under IMG Map Files and navigate to the location where you saved DixieGarminTravelMap.img
3. If you wish to Turn off GPS after transfer check the box
4. If you have custom maps already loaded on your GPS, such as MapSource TOPO US maps, and you want them to remain on your unit check the box next to Add to existing maps
NOTE: If you leave this box unchecked all of the custom maps you have loaded will be deleted and you will have to reinstall them. This will not affect the basemap that came preloaded on your unit.
5. Click Upload to GPS to start the upload
6. The map will appear as the top map in your GPS unit. To turn off the map; navigate to the map setup page in your unit and under the information tab uncheck the box next to Dixie MTP Public Map



Uninstalling Maps

Currently there is no way to only uninstall the Dixie Garmin Travel Map. To uninstall it you will need to either install maps from MapSource over the top of the Dixie Garmin Travel Map or delete the gmapsupp.img file from your unit. **Note:** Deleting the gmapsupp.img file will delete all of the custom maps from the GPS requiring you to reinstall them. Again this will not affect the basemap that came preloaded on your unit.
