SHOSHONE NATIONAL FOREST
SPECIAL ORDER

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b) the following acts are prohibited on the Shoshone National Forest and on all roads, trails, and other areas.

1.To possess or use a motorized vehicle off forest roads. **36 CFR 261.56**

Where developed parking areas are not available, direct access to a suitable parking site or campsite within 300 feet of the roadway is authorized. Such travel is not allowed if otherwise prohibited by sign, barrier, or if such travel would cause resource damage.

2.To operate a vehicle carelessly, recklessly, or without regard for the rights or safety of other persons or in a manner or at a speed that would endanger or be likely to endanger any person or property. **36 CFR 261.54(f)**

3.To operate a vehicle in violation of the speed, load, weight, height, length, width, or in violation of the instructions of any official traffic control device. **36 CFR 261.54(d)**

4.To possess or use a motorized vehicle on any road that is closed or restricted to such use by posted sign, locked gate or barrier, or other physical means. **36 CFR 261.54(b)**

5.To possess or use a motorized vehicle on any trail that is closed or restricted to such use by posted sign, locked gate or barrier, or other physical means. **36 CFR 261.55(b)**

6.To possess or use a motorized vehicle on any forest trail unless such use is authorized by posted sign. **36 CFR 261.55(b)**

7.To possess or use wheeled motorized vehicles on forest snowmobile trails unless otherwise permitted. **36 CFR 261.55(b)**

8.Using a saddle, pack, or draft animal on forest trails, unless the animal is being ridden, or led by a rope, except where hazardous footing exists or where posted. **36 CFR 261.55(c)**

9.Shortcutting a switchback in a forest trail. **36 CFR 261.55(e)**

Pursuant to 36 CFR Section 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
- 3. Persons operating snowmobiles when adequate snow exists to prevent damage and where not otherwise prohibited.**
