Forest Service Documentary “The Greatest Good” Comes To Alabama Public Television

WHO: United States Department of Agriculture - Forest Service and Alabama Public Television

WHAT: “The Greatest Good”, a 2-hour documentary explains the history of the U.S. Forest Service. Alabama Public Television will air the program in two parts.

WHEN: Part one of “The Greatest Good” will air April 5, 2006 at 10 p.m.; Part two will air on April 12, 2006 at 10 p.m.

WHY: “The Greatest Good” tells the story of the U.S. Forest Service and the public land it manages. The film was produced by the U.S. Forest Service and distributed by the Forest History Society. It traces the Forest Service efforts to deliver the most benefits to the most people, while remaining good stewards of the land.

The Forest Service manages four national forests in Alabama that covers more than 665,000 acres of public-owned land. The Bankhead, Conecuh, Tuskegee, and Talladega national forests are located within 17 counties in the state.
