## Forest Unique Features or Highlights

- Pikes Peak – inspiration for the song America the Beautiful
- Spanish Peaks – national geological landmark
- PSICC host to the most 14ers of any national forest in Colorado
- Leadville Ranger District - highest elevation of any district in the U.S. and highest incorporated city in the world
- San Carlos Ranger District – sight of the first developed campground in the FS system at Squirrel Creek
- Host to the R2 Specialty Mule Packstring
- 2nd most active oil and gas production in R2 on the Comanche and Cimarron National Grasslands
- Host to the internationally known dinosaur trackway – Comanche National Grasslands
- PSICC is home to the Hayman Fire and includes much of the front range of Colorado
