Forest Unique Features or Highlights	Highest Peak in Wyoming: Gannett Peak – 13,804 feet. Third largest glacier system in U.S. behing Alaska and Washington and covers more than 6,500 square miles. There are 16 named glaciers and at least 140 unnamed glaciers in the Fitzpatrick Wilderness Area. Largest concentration of Grizzly bears of any forest in the Greater Yellowstone Area
