

## **Olympic National Forest Motorized Dispersed Camping Rules and Regulations**

Dispersed campsites are in areas that have not been improved or developed for recreation; generally, no facilities are available and no fee is required in these areas. Please refer to Olympic National Forest's Motor Vehicle Use Map and the Forest Visitor Map to identify dispersed camping areas.

To protect valuable forest resources, please select your campsite on foot. Use proper precautions when building campfires.

The following rules apply throughout the forest:

- Vehicle use on established routes is allowed within 150-feet of an open road solely for the purpose of accessing a dispersed campsite.
- Avoid camping within 50 feet of a water body or wetland area.
- You may not move, go around, or go over barriers such as gates, rocks, berms, or signs.
- It is unlawful to construct roads or trails.
- It is unlawful to cut, damage, or harm vegetation.
- Motorized vehicles must stay on designated roads or parking sites within developed areas such as campgrounds, picnic areas, trailheads, and boat launches.
