National Travel Rule

The United States Forest Service Travel Management Rule requires each National Forest or Ranger District to designate those roads, trails, and areas open to motorized vehicles. The rule prohibits motor vehicle use off the designated system or use that is inconsistent with the designations.

Where can I get a map and more information?

The Motor Vehicle Use Map (MVUM) is a legal document that illustrates route designations and is reissued each year, much like the hunting proclamations or regulations. It is the user's responsibility to be familiar with the annual MVUM. The map is provided free of charge at local Forest Service offices and on the internet at: www.fs.fed.us/r4/dixie.

What does this mean to the Dixie National Forest?

The Dixie National Forest completed the travel route designation process in the spring of 2009. Motorized cross-country travel is prohibited forest-wide. Motorized vehicle use is allowed only on routes designated as open on the official Dixie National Forest MVUM with the following exceptions:

- Off-road travel for the purpose of firewood gathering is allowed with a permit obtained from a ranger district office.
- Dispersed camping is allowed within 150 feet along designated open routes; however some specific areas will be restricted.
