



Universal Accessibility Guide

Welcome! Angeles National Forest welcomes visitors of all abilities. This guide will be useful in planning recreation activities. The forest offers you a place to renew your spirits. Feel the peace as you quiet your mind, listening to water trickle through the rocks in a stream bed. Discover the excitement of birds, plants, and animals in their natural habitats. Follow a national scenic byway or forest roads that offer access to wildlife, solitude, and panoramic views. Please remember that some forest roads are suitable only for high clearance vehicles.

A National Forest Adventure Pass or InterAgency Pass may be required for vehicles parked in many of these areas.

The Interagency Access Pass entitles the holder to a 50 percent discount on fees charged for facilities and services such as camping, boat launching, and parking at federal facilities. This lifetime passport also provides free entrance to national parks, monuments, and federal recreation areas. The permit admits the passport holder and a carload of accompanying people. Where entry is not by private car, the passport admits the holder, their spouse, children, and parents. There are some instances where permit discounts will not be honored in this way, such as concession-operated facilities.

The Interagency Access Pass is issued free of charge, but you must be medically designated as either disabled or blind to receive one. The passports are not available by mail or phone, but can be obtained in person at any Forest Service office. Applicants must show proof of medically determined permanent disability or eligibility for receiving benefits under federal law.

Chantry Flat Picnic Area

Chantry Flat Picnic Area is located north of the Foothill Freeway (210) at the end of Santa Anita Avenue (which turns into Chantry Flat Road). This area is a day use area which provides opportunities for picnicking, hiking and water play. Chantry Flat Picnic Area provides 3 accessible picnic sites, which includes table, BBQ grill, trash container and restroom.

This area is open from 6 am to 8 pm. Gate closes at 8:00 pm.

Fee: Adventure Pass

Elevation: 2,200 feet

Charlton Flat Picnic Area

This area is located off Angeles Crest Highway (Hwy 2) at Milepost 47.50. This area is a day use area which provides opportunities for picnicking and hiking. Charlton Flat Picnic Area provides 10 acces-

Chilao Picnic Area

Chilao Picnic Area is located off Angeles Crest Highway (Hwy 2) at Milepost 50.65. This area is a day use area which provides opportunities for picnicking and hiking. Chilao Picnic Area provides 2 accessible picnic sites, which includes table, BBQ grill, trash container and restroom.

This area is open from sunrise to sunset.

Fee: Adventure Pass

Elevation: 5,200 feet

Monte Cristo Campground

Monte Cristo Campground is located off Angeles Forest Highway at Milepost 15.18. This area is an overnight campground that provides opportunities for camping and hiking. This campground provides 2 accessible campsites, which includes table, campfire ring, trash container and restroom.

This area is open 24 hrs.

Fee: \$12/day

Elevation: 3,600 feet

Red Box Picnic Area

Redbox Picnic Area is located off Mount Wilson Road and at Angeles Crest Highway (Hwy 2), Milepost 38.38. This area is a day use area which provides opportunities for picnicking and hiking. Redbox Picnic Area provides 1 accessible picnic site, which includes table, BBQ grill, trash container and restroom.

This area is open from sunrise to sunset.

Fee: Adventure Pass

Elevation: 4,600 feet

Stonyvale Picnic Area

Stonyvale Picnic Area is located off Big Tujunga Canyon Road at Milepost 4.80. This area is a day use area which provides opportunities for picnicking, hiking and waterplay. Stonyvale Picnic Area provides 2 accessible picnic sites, which includes table, BBQ grill, trash container, restroom and drinking water.

This area is open from sunrise to sunset.

Fee: Adventure Pass

Elevation: 1,900 feet

Wildwood Picnic Area

Wildwood Picnic Area is located off Big Tujunga Canyon Road at Milepost 3.00. This area is a day use area which provides opportunities for picnicking, hiking and waterplay. Wildwood Picnic Area provides 2 accessible picnic sites, which includes table, BBQ grill, trash container and restroom.

This area is open from 8 am to 6 pm. Gate closed at 6 pm.

Fee: Adventure Pass

Elevation: 1,800 feet

Santa Clara/Mojave Rivers Ranger District

Little Rock Recreation Area

The Littlerock Recreation Area is located on Cheseboro Road, just off Highway 138 near Palmdale. This area is a day use area which provides opportunities for picnicking, fishing and other outdoor recreation activities including an open area for Off-Highway Vehicle users. All facilities within the area are accessible.

This area is open from sunrise to sunset. Gates are closed at night or when the area reaches capacity.

Fee: Adventure Pass

Picnicking

Juniper Picnic Area provides 21 tables, some with shade ramadas, BBQ's, restrooms and piped water during the summer months.

Rocky Point Picnic Area provides 3 picnic sites, which include tables, fire rings, BBQ's, shade ramadas, and a restroom.

Sage Picnic Area provides 4 sites with fire rings, BBQ's, tables, shade ramadas and a restroom.

The Dam Grill and Store sells Adventure Passes as well as food items and boat rentals.

Big Pines Recreation Area

Apple Tree Campground: 8 tent sites (3 accessible sites), picnic tables, fire rings, vault toilet building with accessible pathways, and piped water (shut off when temperatures reaches freezing). Season: Year-round.

Fee: Adventure Pass. First come, first served: no reservations

Elevation: 6,200 feet

Location: From the I-15 near Cajon, take Highway 138 west. Turn left on Angeles Crest Highway and drive 9 miles to the Big Pines Information Station. Just past the station bear right onto Big Pines Highway (County Road N4) and drive 2 miles to the campground.

Peavine Campground: 4 tent sites (2 accessible sites), picnic tables fire rings, vault toilet building with accessible pathways, and piped water (shut off when temperatures reach freezing), fire pits, picnic tables, vault toilets.

Season: Year-round. (Can become inaccessible due to heavy snow conditions during winter months) First come, first served: no reservations.

Fee: Adventure Pass.

Elevation: 6,100 feet

Location: From I-15 near Cajon, take Highway 138 west. Turn left on Angeles Crest Highway and drive 9 miles to the Big Pines Information Station. Just past the station bear

right on Big Pines Highway (County Road N4) and drive 2-1/2 miles to campground.

Mountain Oak Campground: Concessionaire operated facility. There are 17 sites for tents or motor homes up to 18 feet. Accessible, piped water (shut off when temperatures reach freezing), fire rings, picnic tables, and flush toilets and lighting. Season: Last weekend of April through November, subject to change during snow and hazardous road conditions.

Fee: \$17 a night, first come first served, or reservation sites available. For reservations call (877) 444-6777 or TDD (877) 833-6777. Internet: www.Recreation.gov

Elevation: 6,200 feet

Location: From I-15 near Cajon, take Highway 138 west. Turn left on Angeles Crest Highway and drive 9 miles to the Big Pines Information Station. Just past the station bear right onto Big Pines Highway (County Road N4) and drive 3 miles to campground.

Table Mountain Campground: Concessionaire operated facility. There are 115 campsites for tents or motor homes up to 34'. Accessible sites, picnic tables, fire rings, vault toilets, and piped water (shut off when temperatures at freezing). Season: Last weekend of April to November. Campground is first come first served, or by reservation.

Fee: \$20 a night for single sites, \$40 a night for double sites, \$80 a night for group sites. For Reservations call (877) 444-6777 or TDD (877) 833-6777 or visit www.Recreation.gov

Elevation: 7,200 feet

Location: From I-15 near Cajon, take Highway 138 west. Turn left on Angeles Crest Highway and drive 9 miles to the Big Pines Information Station. Just past the station turn right on Table Mountain Road and drive one mile to the campground on your left.

Amenities: Table Mountain Road is a paved 2-lane county road, easily accessible by most vehicles. There is an amphitheater available \$220 a day for use with reservation.

Pyramid Lake Recreation Area

Pyramid Lake Recreation area is located next to Interstate 5 just 20 miles north of Valencia, CA (take Smokey Bear exit). Pyramid Lake offers boating, fishing, water-skiing, swimming, jet-skiing, day-use picnic areas and nearby overnight camping. Facilities and services are provided by the USDA - Forest Service in cooperation with California Department of Water Resources, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department and the California Departments of Boating and Waterways and Parks and Recreation.

Pyramid Lake is operated by a concessionaire under permit from the USDA - Forest Service. A parking fee is charged, and these fees are used for the operation

Parking Fees:

\$10 per single car

\$18 single car with boat under 21feet

\$24 car with boat over 21 feet

\$24 RV/Bus

\$30 RV/Bus with boat

\$18 car with 1-2 Jet Skis

\$10 each additional Jet Ski over 2.

Emigrant Landing: Main area for Pyramid Lake Recreation Area. Accessible facilities include boat ramp to the lake, picnic areas, and restrooms.

Bear Trap Boat-in-Site: Currently under reconstruction. Facility will have accessible picnic sites and restroom, dock area.

Yellow Bar Boat-in-Site: Accessible picnic sites, restroom and dock.

Vaquero: Offers a swimming beach, boat launch facilities (open during weekends, summer months) for craft under 12 feet in length, and 15 ramadas for picnicking, accessible. Facility is also accessible by boat. Hours of operation vary by season.

Los Alamos Campground: Located 2 1/2 miles west of Emigrant Landing. Los Alamos campground provides 93 family units complete with flush toilets, piped water, tables and barbecues. There are three loops, each offering accessible sites. Family units are on a first-come, first-served basis; however, reservations are needed for the group site. Camping Fees:

\$18 per night 1 car

Add \$9 each add'l car (3 car max per site if they fit)

Up to 6 people, 3 tents per site.

\$85 per night Group Sites up to 25 people max. Reservations required and 1/2 of the camping fee paid as a deposit.

Bouquet Canyon Area

Los Cantiles: Currently Closed and under re-construction.

Fee: To be determined

5 large sites with stoves, tables, on large shade ramada, piped water and flush toilets. Los Cantiles Day Area is fully accessible.

Elevation: 1,200 feet

Location: From Interstate 5 exit Magic Mountain Parkway to Bouquet Canyon Road. Turn left on Bouquet Canyon road and drive northeast to the picnic area

San Gabriel River Ranger District

Glenn Trail Camp

Glenn Camp is first-come/first served. Three sites are accessible for those with disabilities.. Pit toilets and stream water available. Open fires in the fire pit are allowed with a campfire permit and charcoal in the grill provided.

Fee: Golden Passport or Adventure Pass required for vehicles parked at trailhead.

Elevation: 2,000 feet

Location: From the 210 Fwy exit Azusa Avenue. Drive 12 miles north on San Gabriel Canyon Road (Hwy 39) to the West Fork of the San Gabriel River. Hike 6.5 miles west from Highway 39 to Glenn Trail Camp.

Amenities: A bicycle trail runs along side the West Fork. Trout fishing is available, catch and keep, from the gate to the second bridge, catch and release from the second bridge up to Cogswell Reservoir. Off-road vehicle area located 2 miles south.

West Fork Road/West Fork River

West Fork Road is a seven mile route from Hwy 39 to Glenn Camp. Along the way are four fishing platforms, located along the West Fork River, designed with the handicapped angler in mind. A valid California fishing license is required. Only artificial lures with single barbless hooks are allowed in the West Fork and it's tributaries. From the second bridge up it is designated as 'Catch and Release'.

Los Alamos Campground

Located 2 1/2 miles west of Emigrant Landing. Los Alamos campground provides 93 family units complete with flush toilets, piped water, tables and barbecues. There are three loops, each offering accessible sites. Family units are on a first-come, first-served basis; however, reservations are needed for the group site.
