The U.S. Forest Service is offering schools, festivals and large groups the opportunity to learn about their environment through interactive lessons on flora and fauna, geology, fisheries and more with a visit from a mobile ecology classroom designed by volunteers, educators and Rangers.

Stations Wildlife
 Botany
 Fisheries/Hydrology
 Geology

Lengths 15 – 30 minutes
 30 minutes – 1 hour
 1 hour to ½ day

Activity Options

- Fur, scat, skull, and track examination and wildlife games. Bird watching and bird call lessons. Animal adaptations, the food cycle, animals and our world activities.
- Tree, wildflower and invasive plant identification.
- Fish painting, water testing and water bug lessons. Watershed ecology, salmon life cycle and stream restoration.
- Volcano building, petroglyph art, mineral, soil testing, geology, and tectonic plate activities.

Note: Art supplies, paper and pencil and other basic supplies must be provided by the classroom, depending upon activity chosen.
