

DESCRIPTION PURSUANT TO CT2.35# (OPTION 1) - INDIVIDUAL TREE DESIGNATION (06/08)Payment Units 2, 38, and 94

Gaps: All Douglas-fir, Western Hemlock, Noble Fir, and Pacific Silver Fir trees, except dead standing trees, within 25 feet of a tree that has Yellow paint above and below stump height are designated for cutting. Yellow painted trees are to be left standing.

Skips: All trees, within 25 feet of a tree that has Orange paint above and below stump height are to be left standing. Orange painted trees are to be left standing.

DxD: Outside of the above described areas, all Douglas-fir, Western Hemlock, Noble Fir, and Pacific Silver Fir trees, except dead standing trees, are designated for cutting if they are within 14 feet of a tree that has a larger stump diameter than it. Trees within Skips described above and/or trees marked with Orange paint above and below stump height that are used to designate the Payment Unit boundary may be used to determine cut trees.

Payment Unit 4, 6, 22, 61, 62, 78, 86, and 105

LTM: All coniferous trees not marked with Pink paint, except dead standing trees, are designated for cutting.

Payment Units 11, 13, and 34

DxD: All Douglas-fir, Western Hemlock, Noble Fir, and Pacific Silver Fir trees, except dead standing trees, are designated for cutting if they are within 14 feet of a tree that has a larger stump diameter than it. Trees marked with Orange paint above and below stump height that are used to designate the Payment Unit boundary may be used to determine cut trees.

Payment Unit 14

Gaps: All Douglas-fir and Western Hemlock trees, except dead standing trees, within 25 feet of a tree that has Yellow paint above and below stump height are designated for cutting. Yellow painted trees are to be left standing.

DxD: Outside of the above described areas, all Douglas-fir and Western Hemlock trees, except dead standing trees, are designated for cutting if they are within 14 feet of a tree that has a larger stump diameter than it. Trees marked with Orange paint above and below stump height that are used to designate the Payment Unit boundary may be used to determine cut trees.

Payment Units 16, 30, 40, and 72

Gaps: All Douglas-fir and Western Hemlock trees, except dead standing trees, within 25 feet of a tree that has Yellow paint above and below stump height are designated for cutting. Yellow painted trees are to be left standing.

Skips: All trees, within 25 feet of a tree that has Orange paint above and below stump height are to be left standing. Orange painted trees are to be left standing.

DxD: Outside of the above described areas, all Douglas-fir and Western Hemlock trees, except dead standing trees, are designated for cutting if they are within 15 feet of a tree that has a larger stump diameter than it. Trees within Skips described above and/or trees marked with Orange paint above and below stump height that are used to designate the Payment Unit boundary may be used to determine cut trees.

Payment Unit 18

Gaps: All Douglas-fir, Western Hemlock, Noble Fir, and Pacific Silver Fir trees, except dead standing trees, within 25 feet of a tree that has Yellow paint above and below stump height are designated for cutting. Yellow painted trees are to be left standing.

Skips: All trees, within 25 feet of a tree that has Orange paint above and below stump height are to be left standing. Orange painted trees are to be left standing.

DxD: Outside of the above described areas, all Douglas-fir, Western Hemlock, Noble Fir, and Pacific Silver Fir trees, except dead standing trees, are designated for cutting if they are within 15 feet of a tree that has a larger stump diameter than it. Trees within Skips described above and/or trees marked with Orange paint above and below stump height that are used to designate the Payment Unit boundary may be used to determine cut trees.

Payment Unit 28

DxD: All Douglas-fir, Western Hemlock, Noble Fir, Pacific Silver Fir, Grand Fir, and Western Red Cedar trees, except dead standing trees, are designated for cutting if they are within 15 feet of a tree that has a larger stump diameter than it. Trees marked with Orange paint above and below stump height that are used to designate the Payment Unit boundary may be used to determine cut trees.

Payment Units 36 and 102

Gaps: All Douglas-fir trees, except dead standing trees, within 25 feet of a tree that has Yellow paint above and below stump height are designated for cutting. Yellow painted trees are to be left standing.

Skips: All trees, within 25 feet of a tree that has Orange paint above and below stump height are to be left standing. Orange painted trees are to be left standing.

DxD: Outside of the above described areas, all Douglas-fir trees, except dead standing trees, are designated for cutting if they are within 14 feet of a tree that has a larger stump diameter than it. Trees within Skips described above and/or trees marked with Orange paint above and below stump height that are used to designate the Payment Unit boundary may be used to determine cut trees.

Payment Units 48, 50, 56, 60, 84, 106, and 108

Gaps: All Douglas-fir, Western Hemlock, Noble Fir, Pacific Silver Fir, Grand Fir, and Western Red Cedar trees, except dead standing trees, within 25 feet of a tree that has Yellow paint above and below stump height are designated for cutting. Yellow painted trees are to be left standing.

Skips: All trees, within 25 feet of a tree that has Orange paint above and below stump height are to be left standing. Orange painted trees are to be left standing.

DxD: Outside of the above described areas, all Douglas-fir, Western Hemlock, Noble Fir, Pacific Silver Fir, Grand Fir, and Western Red Cedar trees, except dead standing trees, are designated for cutting if they are within 15 feet of a tree that has a larger stump diameter than it. Trees within Skips described above and/or trees marked with Orange paint above and below stump height that are used to designate the Payment Unit boundary may be used to determine cut trees.

Payment Unit 80

Gaps: All Douglas-fir, Noble Fir, and Pacific Silver Fir trees, except dead standing trees, within 25 feet of a tree that has Yellow paint above and below stump height are designated for cutting. Yellow painted trees are to be left standing.

Skips: All trees, within 25 feet of a tree that has Orange paint above and below stump height are to be left standing. Orange painted trees are to be left standing.

DxD: Outside of the above described areas, all Douglas-fir, Noble Fir, and Pacific Silver Fir trees, except dead standing trees, are designated for cutting if they are within 15 feet of a tree that has a larger stump diameter than it. Trees within Skips described above and/or trees marked with Orange paint above and below stump height that are used to designate the Payment Unit boundary may be used to determine cut trees.

Payment Unit 92

DxD: All Douglas-fir and Western Hemlock trees, except dead standing trees, are designated for cutting if they are within 14 feet of a tree that has a larger stump diameter than it. Trees marked with Orange paint above and below stump height that are used to designate the Payment Unit boundary may be used to determine cut trees.

Definitions:

Distances are measured slope distance, outside bark minimum stump height to outside bark minimum stump height.

Minimum stump height is measured 4 inches from the ground on the uphill side of the tree. Trees will be cut at or above minimum stump height, not to exceed maximum stump height in AT.6.

Stump diameter is measured outside bark at minimum stump height in a horizontal plane and is the average of a measurement across the short axis through the true center of the stump and a second measurement at right angles to the short axis.

Trees that fork below minimum stump height will be considered 2 trees. Trees that fork above minimum stump height will be considered 1 tree.
