Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a) & (b), I prohibit the following acts on all National Forest lands within the boundaries of the Granite Chief Wilderness as described below and shown in Exhibit 1:

Group Size

Groups larger than (12) persons. 36 CFR 261.58(f).

Five Lakes Basin

1. Camping within six hundred (600) feet of any lake in the Five Lakes Basin, Section 6, T.15 N., R.16 E., MDM. 36 CFR 261.58(e).
2. Building, maintaining, attending, or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire within six hundred (600) feet of any lake within the Five Lakes Basin, Section 6, T.15 N., R.16 E. MDM. 36 CFR 36 CFR 261.52(a).

Whiskey Creek

1. Camping within two hundred fifty (250) feet on any structure at Whiskey Creek, Section 11, T.15 N., R.15 E., MDM. 36 CFR 261.58(e).
2. Building, maintaining, attending, or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire within two hundred fifty (250) feet of any structure at Whiskey Creek, Section 11, T.15 N., R.15 E., MDM. 36 CFR 261.52(a).

Pack or Saddle Stock

1. Possessing pack or saddle stock within six hundred (600) feet of any lake in the Five Lakes Basin, Section 6, T.15 N., R.16 E., MDM; Little Needle Lake, Section 4, T.15 N., R.15 E., MDM; or Mildred Lake, Section 8, T.15 N., R.15 E., MDM., except for ingress and egress on the Five Lakes Trail. 36 CFR 261.58(aa).
2. Pack or saddle stock in excess of twelve (12) animals per group for day use, or eight (8) animals per group for overnight use. 36 CFR 261.57(b)

Dogs

Dogs within the following fawning areas are prohibited: The wilderness portion of the French Meadows Game Refuge, west of the Pacific Crest Trail, the Big Springs Trail in Section 14, T.15 N., R.15 E., MDM., or on the land between the Big Springs Trail and the Five Lakes Creek in Section 14, T.15 N., R.15 E., MDM. CFR 261.57(a).

Persons exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

This prohibition is in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261.
