Snow Grooming Report 2011: Think Snow!

Almanor Ranger District:

No new grooming; need more snow. Snowshoers are asked to please stay off the cross-country ski trails due to safety concerns.

Eagle Lake Ranger District:

Our Swain Trail System holds the most snow. The cold temperatures of January have maintained our snow pack. On the Swain trails, there are no exposed dirt patches, but some icy stretches. When the afternoon sunshine warms, the snow conditions become spring-like. We have been impressed with the amount of trail use this system is receiving. Kudos to all of you who've come out to enjoy the freshness of the season.

Fredonyer Trail System is sketchy. There are dirt patches along the 29N86, 29N05, and the 29N86 roads. Exposed rocks and long dirt sections make it impossible to travel this route.

Bogard trails continue to hold on to the minimal snow pack. There are some exposed areas across the Pine Creek Valley. The snow-play/hill-climbs on the north slope of Antelope Mountain have exposed Manzanita shoots poking through the crust. Use caution when riding these trails!

Hat Creek Ranger District:

Hat Creek trails are in fair shape this week. Trails are icy in the morning and soft in the afternoon. There are several washouts on the Latour system. Most areas are signed, but please be cautious of running water.

The warmer temperatures are affecting lower Asphan. The Greyback area has a bit more snow due to less traffic and more shade. To conserve the snow, please avoid burnouts and cutting turns. Care for your trails and think snow!
