Description: Stem leaves are alternate, smooth, and glossy. Leaves have rounded, toothed margins and are reduced in shape upwards. Flowers are solitary heads, composed of white ray florets and yellow disc florets.

Crimes committed: Can quickly replace up to 50% of grasses in pastures. Commonly sold in wildflower seed mixes and transplanted as an ornamental.
