

# Candy Branch Rifle Range



The Candy Branch Rifle Range was designed with the needs of shooters in mind. It includes right-handed, left-handed and accessible shooting benches, 25- and 100-yard backstops and permits the use of pistols and rifles.

## Range Rules:

- All weapons must meet South Carolina firearm safety standards. For more information go to [www.dnr.sc.gov](http://www.dnr.sc.gov).
- No alcoholic beverages
- No tracer or incendiary ammunition
- Skeet and trap shooting is not permitted
- Shoot only at paper targets mounted on the target wires
- Shoot only from the firing line, downrange and into the backstop
- Shooters under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult
- Properly dispose of litter, including target
- Open year round, sunrise to sunset

**Directions:** From Anderson, travel south on Hwy. 28 to the four-way stop in Abbeville. Turn right and travel 3.3 miles to the intersection of Hwy. 28 and Hwy. 72. Turn left onto Hwy. 72 and travel 1.9 miles. Turn right at Palmetto Bank onto South Main Street (also known as Cedar Springs Road). Travel 6.2 miles and turn right onto Candy Branch Road. Travel for 0.7 miles. Entrance is on left.
