

# Lick Fork Lake Hiking Trail



The Lick Fork Lake Hiking Trail is located in the Lick Fork Lake Recreation Area on the southeastern portion of the Long Cane Ranger District.

As you traverse the picturesque woods surrounding the lake, you will encounter a boulder crossing, mixed hardwood and pine canopies, as well as a variety of wild flowers that flourish along the trail.

## Fees

- \$3 day-use fee per vehicle for visitors to Lick Fork Lake Recreation Area
- **Self-serve fee station**

**Directions:** From the square in downtown Edgefield, travel south on Hwy. 23 for 8.3 miles. Bear left onto Hwy. 230 and travel 0.4 miles. Turn left onto Lick Fork Lake Road (S 19-263), and travel 1.9 miles. Entrance is on right.

**Length:** 2.0 miles

**Surface type:** Natural, some rocky areas

**Trail blaze:** White

**Requirements:** No motorized vehicles, mountain bikes, horses or alcoholic beverages.

**Safety:** Avoid trail use during first two weeks of rifle deer season. Wear blaze orange the entire hunting season. Be mindful of traffic when traveling on or crossing roads.



## Amenities:
