

Long Cane Horse Trail



The Long Cane Horse Trail is located in the northern part of the Long Cane Ranger District. This 26.7-mile loop trail winds through the pines and hardwoods of the Long Cane Scenic Area and passes the largest Shagbark Hickory tree in the United States. A historic cemetery and the original "Charleston Road" enhance the visitor experience.

Numerous access points and a convenient cut through enables riders to adjust the length and duration of their ride.

Fees:

- \$3 day-use fee per vehicle for visitors to Fell Camp
- **Self-serve fee station**

Directions: From Greenwood Mall (also known as Cross Creek Mall), take Hwy. 72 west towards Abbeville for 1.3 miles. Turn left onto Calhoun Road and travel 1.7 miles. Turn right onto Hwy. 10 and travel 6.2 miles. Turn right onto S 24-4 and travel 2.4 miles to entrance on left.

Length: 26.7 miles

Surface Type: Natural, dirt, gravel or paved roads may be encountered.

Trail blaze: White reflective

Requirements: Specialized permit is required for organized rides of 12 or more and overnight camping along the trail.

Safety: Avoid trail use the first two weeks of rifle deer season. Wear blaze orange. Be mindful of traffic when traveling on or crossing roads.




Amenities:
