Wine-Turkey **Creek Trail**









This linear trail is located in the southeastern part of the Long Cane Ranger District. Visitors enjoy the option of riding the 12-mile (one way) Wine-Turkey-Creek Trail, the 5.5-mile Modoc Trail or exploring them both on the same day.

The renovation of the historic Key Bridge allows access to both Wine-Turkey and Modoc trails from the parking area at Price's Bottom.

Safety: Avoid trail use during the first two weeks of rifle deer season. Wear blaze orange the entire hunting season. Be mindful of traffic when traveling on or crossing roads.
