

Sewee Shell Mound Interpretive Trail



The mystique surrounding the area encompassed by this one-mile, self-guided, interpretive trail dates back 4,000 years. The trail begins along a shady lane of trees which opens into an area heavily influenced by the forces of nature and man. A large portion of the area was scarred by Hurricane Hugo and wildfire. It is a picture of a land in recovery.

The 120-foot boardwalk overlooks a prehistoric shell mound and offers five interpretive stops in addition to breathtaking views of the salt marsh, tidal creek and the Intracoastal Waterway.

Directions: From Charleston, take US Highway 17 North to Doar Road North (SC Route 432-S). Turn right and go 2.1 miles to Salt Pond Road. Turn right onto Salt Pond Road (FS Road 243) and go 0.1 miles to trailhead.

Difficulty Level: Easy

Length: One mile

Surface: Unsurfaced, grassy

Season: Year round. Fall, winter and spring are recommended.

Safety: During temperate months, be prepared for biting insects and high temperatures.



Restrictions: No camping. Hikers and day use only. No digging.
