

Hickory Ridge Horse Camp & Trail System

Location specific information

Use type: hiking, mountain biking, primitive camping and horse riding

Length of trail system: 45.9 miles

Facilities: a primitive campground with picnic tables, pit toilets, hitching racks, mounting ramp and water for livestock (not potable for humans)

Special features: a variety of long and short interconnecting loops and scenic hardwoods

Directions

GPS coordinates—to horse camp:

38°58'37.617"N, 86°17'41.087"W

From Ind. 446 turn east on Ind. 58. Proceed 6.5 miles to Norman. Turn left at the stop sign to continue on Ind. 58. Proceed another 0.3 miles and turn left onto County Road 1250 W at the brown Forest Service sign. Continue 2.2 miles to the Hickory Ridge Trailhead/Campground on your left.



Etiquette and rules

Horse riders and mountain bikers (age 17 years and older) are required to have a permit and stay on designated trails. Permits are available from our offices or local vendors (see website). Forest trails are closed to all motorized vehicles.

Follow Leave No Trace principles.

Private and public land ownership is scattered within the Forest boundary. Visitors must take care to stay on National Forest System lands and respect private property.







HICKORY RIDGE HORSE CAMP AND TRAIL SYSTEM
