## Description

Approximate Length: 7.7 miles

Type: Hiking, horse riding and mountain biking.

Special Features: Scenic hardwood forest. Trail passes near an early 19th century free African-American settlement; only a family cemetery and the traces of home sites remain. See related sheet on Lick Creek African American Settlement.

## Etiquette and Rules

Horse riders and mountain bikers (age 17 years and older) are required to have a permit and stay on trails designated for that type of use. Permits are available from our offices and local vendors.

Observe the following trail courtesy:

- Mountain bikers yield to horse riders and hikers. Make your approach known in advance.
- Hikers yield to horse riders.
- Horse riders control your horse.
- Pack out your trash.

Motorized travel is not permitted.

## Safety

Use caution during hunting seasons. Blaze orange clothing is recommended (do not wear white) during deer season.


Ticks and chiggers are common in southern Indiana. Take necessary precautions including avoiding tall grass and thick brushy areas.

Loose limbs and hazard trees can fall on the trail at anytime, especially on windy days.

5.3 miles south of Paoli on S.R. 37, turn left on County Road 450 South. A sign for Marengo Cave marks the intersection. Follow County Road 450 South for one mile to the Lick Creek Parking Area on the left.




