## Description

Approximate Length: 7.2 miles, another 6.5 miles are included in the adjacent Oriole Trail East.

Type: Hiking, horse riding and mountain biking.

Special Features: Scenic hardwood forests.

## Etiquette and Rules

Horse riders and mountain bikers (age 17 years and older) are required to have a permit and stay on trails designated for that type of use. Permits are available from our offices and local vendors.

Observe the following trail courtesy:

- Mountain bikers yield to horse riders and hikers. Make your approach known in advance.
- Hikers yield to horse riders.
- Horse riders control your horse.
- Pack out your trash.

Motorized travel is not permitted.

## Safety

Use caution during hunting seasons. Blaze orange clothing is recommended (do not wear white) during deer season.


If a parking lot is not available where you wish access, be sure your vehicle is well off the road.

Many trails intersect roadways. If you choose to use a road as part of your trip, be mindful of traffic.


